As you know by now, the AAUW Used Bookstore needs to vacate our space by February 28th. The inventory reduction sale has started. The store will be open every Thursday and Saturday (11am – 2pm or longer) until the last week in February when we will be moving & storing remaining inventory to the vacated space of the vacated Radio Shack area.

Because the timing of our closing is in February, we will only be storing our inventory in the mall, thus allowing us to have more time to decide about the future of the store. At this point we don't want to close the store for good, but we have only a few months to make a decision. In the meantime, it's important to sell as much as possible so we don't have to move it again!! There will always be new donations for us if we open again in a different location.

Factors to Consider

- ⇒ There is not a space left at the Buffalo Mall.
- ⇒ Considering other malls in town

doesn't seem like be a good fit either.

- ⇒ A stand-alone store front would not provide a place with walk-by traffic, so when we aren't open people could see our spot and schedules.

Patsy introduced our brunch speaker, Hong Mawby. Hong's parents immigrated from China to Vietnam. She gave background of what it was like in Vietnam before they left. [Her father did not want his children to live like this and put his children on the boat to the refugee camp in Malaysia. At the camp, many had to stand in line for clean water and food. The 41st anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 was the end of one nightmare and the start of another for ethnic Chinese living in communist Vietnam. Life in Vietnam under the communists after the war was not good. The family factory was nationalized and children were ordered to attend nightly communist

meetings.*] Planes flew the orphaned children in to other refugee camps. One of the planes crashed and killed many of the children. She shared what it was like to come to Jamestown and how she has helped translate for other refugees. Families were separated on the trip to the U.S. and now are reconnecting through Facebook. It is a lasting memory of events that changed their lives and continues to affect them to this day.



AAUW Grants only supply \$2500 instead of the \$5000 as before. \$5000 from state. JSAC gave \$1000. \$600 from AAUW from last couple of years. Applied for \$2500 Cargill grant. Our Tech Savvy program has secured \$8500 of the total cost of \$11,000.

National By-laws

National AAUW has come forth with many different mandatory changes of the by-laws in the last few years. These latest changes need to be completed by January 31, 2017.

This update has consolidated several previous changes into the first seven Articles, some of this has been scattered throughout the by-laws in the past. These first seven articles are MANDATORY changes, mostly just inserting the local branch name (Jamestown).

Deb Alber updated the by-laws, but would like the Steering Committee to review at their next meeting .

Deb made some minor wording changes in our portion of the by-laws adhering to the changes that National has made such as replacing the word **Branch** with **Affiliate** or AAUW Jame-

stown to make it easier to understand; changing **President** to **Administrative Officer**, etc. But the meat of our local by-laws should read the same as before. She also had to make some minor changes mostly in **renumbering** the articles and **omitting the redundant and/or duplicate information** from National that was incorporated throughout with previous mandatory updates.
