

Instructions for renewing your AAUW membership. Follow the steps and It is quite easy to renew with a credit or debit card. If you have questions, please contact Mary Craft 714-335-4630. Of course, you still can mail a check for \$87 to Mary Craft, Box 65, Spiritwood, ND 58481 & she will process your membership.

First, use the link in the email message to get to the National website and the message has information about logging onto your Personal Snapshot.

Check your email, phone number, and mailing address. The next step lists your education, so check if the name of the university, your degree and date of your degree is correct. You can add a new degree if you wish. **Select** National FY24.

Select Yes for adding Branch and State dues.

Select the branch which is **ND6007-Jamestown** (yes, you have to scroll and scroll down to find our branch.)

Then **Next** to select Jamestown as your primary branch. **Select** North Dakota State Dues.

There is an **option** to donate to the Greatest Need Fund. No code is necessary.

Input your payment (Credit or Debit card) information. Submit.

The order information will display and you can print this, if you wish.

That's it!! You will receive an email for the order information.
